Who is "US"?

GEN 1:26-27 NKJ ²⁶ Then God said, "Let <u>Us</u> make man in <u>Our image</u>, according to <u>Our likeness</u>; let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth." ²⁷ So God created man in His *own* image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them.

Q: "US" means more than one ... so who was with God? And what is Their image and likeness?

A: There was God (Gen I.1), the Holy Spirit (Gen I:2), and the Word. (John I:1, and I John 5:7).

GEN 1:1-2 NKJ 1 In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. ² The earth was without form, and void; and darkness was on the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters.

1 John 5:7 NKJ 7 For there are three that bear witness in heaven: the **Father**, the **Word**, and the **Holy Spirit**; and these three are one.

Q: How am I created in Their image and likeness?

 John 4:24 NKJ: ²⁴ God is Spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth." Wisdom was with God duving Creation, and has been personified::

Proverbs 8:1, 22-31 NKJ excerpts:

8 Does not **wisdom** cry out, And **understanding** lift up her voice?

²² "The LORD possessed me at the beginning of His way, Before His works of old.

²⁷ When He prepared the heavens, I was there,....

³⁰ Then I was beside Him as a master craftsman; And I was daily *His* delight, Rejoicing always before Him,
³¹ Rejoicing in His inhabited world, And my delight was with the sons of men.

The Holy Spirit is a spirit being consisting of 7 spirits

God is a spirit being

•Isaiah 11:2 NKJ: ² The **Spirit of the Lord** shall rest upon Him,
The Spirit of **wisdom** and **understanding**,
The Spirit of **counsel** and **might**,
The Spirit of **knowledge** and of the **fear of the Lord**.

I am a spirit being, just like them

•1 Thess 5:23 NKJ ²³ Now may the God of peace Himself sanctify you completely; and may **your whole spirit**, soul, and body be preserved blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

A: I am like them (created in their image and likeness) because I am a spirit being too (I Thess 5:23).

Q: So what about the Word? What is the Word?

<u>1 John 5:7 NKJ</u> ⁷ For there are three that bear witness in heaven: the **Father**, the **Word**, and the **Holy Spirit**; and these three are one.



Q: Why did it not say Jesus or "the Son"?
A: Because it's referring to the spoken Word of God, not Jesus.

Here's why.....John 1:1, John 1:14, & 2 Cor 5:19:

John I:I begins and clearly refers to Genesis I, where God <u>SPOKE</u> to create everything. "He" refers to the <u>spoken</u> Word of God, as John I:I starts out. Replace "Word", "He" and "Him" with "the <u>spoken</u> Word of God" and it mirrors Genesis I closely. "He" and "Him" are similar to how Wisdom is personified as "she" in Proverbs.

John 1:1 NKJ 1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was in the beginning with God. ³ All things were made through Him, and without Him nothing was made that was made. ⁴ In Him was life, and the life was the light of men. ⁵ And the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not comprehend it.

John 1:1 NKJ 1 In the beginning was the spoken Word of God, and the spoken Word of God was with God, and the spoken Word of God was God. ² The spoken Word of God was in the beginning with God. ³ All things were made through the spoken Word of God, and without the spoken Word of God nothing was made that was made. ⁴ In the spoken Word of God was life, and the life was the light of men. ⁵ And the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not comprehend it.

Therefore, a few verses later in John 1:14, the "Word became flesh" means that the spoken Word of God manifested in Jesus, who was just a man.

<u>John 1:14 NKJ</u> ¹⁴ And the **Word became flesh** and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth.

Also, 2 Cov 5:19 says that God was <u>in</u> Jesus.....not God was Jesus:

<u>2 Corinthians 5:19 NKJ</u> ¹⁹ that is, that God was <u>in</u> Christ reconciling the world to Himself, not imputing their trespasses to them, and has committed to us the word of reconciliation.
