

## The Physical Attributes of God and The Characteristics of God

Here is a list of the physical attributes of God that we found in scripture. Also, we have a list of the characteristics of God, which includes his nature, his character, and his personality.

## The Physical Attributes of God

- God is a spirit being (*John 4:24*).
- A spirit has no flesh and bones (*Luke 24:39*).
- A spirit does have material and physical substance (II Kings 6: 17).
- No man has seen God (*John 1:18*).
- No man may see his face and go on living (Exodus 33:20).
- The Glory of God (*Exodus 33:18*).
- Face or front side (*Exodus 33:23*).
- Back, backside, or back parts (*Exodus 33:23*).
- Hand (*Exodus 33:22-23*).
- Right and left hand (I Kings 22:19).
- Arms (*Job 40:9*).
- Voice like rumbling thunder (*Job 40:9*).
- Voice a great voice, as of a trumpet (Revelation 1:10).
- Has the ability to sit or stand (*Psalm 110:1*) (*Revelation 4:2*).

## The Characteristics of God, his nature, his character, and his personality

- God is a God of integrity.
- God has chosen to make these characteristics part of the distinctive qualities that makes him who he is.
- God has set himself apart from all others gods that man could claim to serve.
- God, he is God and there is none else besides him, for there is no one else like him (*Deuteronomy* 4:35).
- God, he is God in heaven above and upon the earth beneath, for there is no other god than him (*Deuteronomy 4:39*).
- for there is no iniquity with the Lord our God, nor respect of persons, nor taking of gifts (*II Chronicles 19:7*).
- (There is absolutely no injustice, immorality, unrighteousness, or wrong doings with God).
- (There is no partiality or any unfair preferences for one person or group over another with God).

- Do not know a physical description but we see his splendor (*Revelation 4:3*).
- He lives forever and ever (*Revelation 4:9*).
- Worthy to receive glory, honor, and power because it was he who created all things, for his pleasure and by his will that all things came into existence, and were created (*Revelation 4:11*).
- He is the Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the ending, which is, and which was, and which is to come (*Revelation 1:8*).
- He is the Alpha and Omega, the first and the last (*Revelation 1:11*).
- Seven Spirits of God (Revelation 4:5) (Isaiah 11:2).

- (God cannot be bribed with gifts, promises, or the like, for there is no taking of gifts with God).
- God creates evil (*Isaiah 45:7*) and that he knows evil (*Genesis 3:22*), we know that evil is not part of his character.
- God, who is good (*Nahum 1:7*) does not deal in or with evil.
- "Remember the former things of old: for I am God, and there is none else; I am God, and there is none like me, declaring the end from the beginning, and from ancient times the things that are not yet done, saying, My counsel shall stand, and I will do all my pleasure" (Isaiah 46:9-10).
- "For I am the Lord, I change not" (Malachi 3:6).
- Whatever God did in the beginning is the same thing that God is doing today, for he is unchanged.
- God cannot lie (Titus 1:2), for it is impossible for God to lie (Hebrews 6:18), meaning that he must keep his word.
- Our God is one of integrity.
- It is impossible for God to be untrue to himself (*II Timothy 2:13*).
- God is omniscient or all-knowing (*I John 3:20*).
- The purpose of the Lord stands forever and that his intentions are the same for every generation (*Psalm 33:11*).
- As we draw near to God, he will reveal himself to
  us. God does not hide himself from those who
  truly seek him with all of their being, with all their
  heart and soul (*Deuteronomy 4:29*).

- Accountability, the process of holding man totally responsible for his actions. God holds man solely accountable for his actions.
- "For God is not the author of confusion (disorder)" (I Corinthians 14:33). We know that God does not arbitrarily do anything that he does, especially when it comes to the wording of certain things. God has a reason for doing all that he does.
- "God does not tempt any man to do anything that would be considered wrong or evil" (James 1:13).
- "For there is no respect of persons with God" (Romans 2:11).
- "Those who are wise will take all this to heart; they will see in our history the faithful love of the Lord" (Psalm 107:43 NIV).
- God is "a source of encouragement" to his children

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For the body is one, comprised of many members and being many, the members collectively are one body. It is by the one Spirit that we, being many are baptized into one body; for this body is not one but a collective.
